



City Church Chelmsford

History

City Church Chelmsford was launched by Danbury Mission (DM) Church in 2020. DM Church was planted a hundred years before that by a local builder who shared the gospel in public and gathered a church in his home.

God has chosen to grow DM Church rapidly over the past thirty years, with many coming from the nearby city of Chelmsford. So DM Church launched City Church Chelmsford to meet the growing needs of an expanding city. The 33 adults in the "launch team" were forged

together by the Covid pandemic and, in October 2021, incorporated the former members of Broomfield Road Evangelical Church (BREC) and "re-launched" as one new church in the BREC building.

Today that building is full with about 130 attending Sunday gatherings; a third from DM, a third from BREC, and another third from elsewhere.

Locally we're the first initiative of "Mission Essex," a new collection of churches working together to plant and revitalise churches in our county (more on the back page).







Mission

We summarise the God-given mission of the church with the words "Reach, Build, Send". To reach people with the saving message of Jesus, build them up his likeness, and send them out in his name and for his glory.

Our vision for 2022 was to see someone who wasn't a Christian become one. And we've been delighted to see God answer that prayer! Our vision for 2023 is to read the Bible with at least 10 people who are not yet Christians.

Activities

We celebrate the work of God in every area of life. And we believe this is our "front line" where God has placed to reach our neighbours and colleagues with the good news of Jesus.

Our main gathered activity is our Sunday meeting. We run a monthly prayer meeting. More than twothirds of us gather in "home groups" that meet weekly for friendship, teaching, and pastoral support.

We run groups for young people up to age 18 and a daytime group for mothers with young children. We help to sponsor the local Christians Against Poverty Debt Centre and are involved with the Food Bank and two local university Christian Unions.

The Project




Location

Essex has a rich Christian history. It saw one of the first church plants in England, played a key role in the Reformation, sent out one of the first modern missionaries, and gave birth to Charles Spurgeon.

Today Essex is in the fastest growing part of the country.
But it is spiritually poor with only 3% church attendance compared to a national average of 5% and 8% in London. Simply maintaining 3% attendance over the next ten years would require 30 new churches like ours! Reaching 5% attendance would require all existing churches to double in size!

Chelmsford is the "county town" and hub of Essex. We believe God

wants to establish City Church
Chelmsford in the Waterfront Place
building in the centre of Chelmsford.
Waterfront Place is scenically
located between a canal and the
river Chelmer in the brand new
Chelmer Waterside development.
About 500 new homes have
already been built with another 1000
planned over the next 10 years.



Need

City Church Chelmsford need a larger meeting place! The current site cannot be developed due to its age, size, and location. Renting has proved difficult because of limited supply, increasing scepticism towards religious groups, and heightened caution following the pandemic.

A permanent meeting place would enhance our presence in the community. It would allow us to expand our daily ministry to young people, the poor, families and students in ways that renting would prohibit. A location in central Chelmsford would make us more accessible to our city and the county of Essex.









Building

Waterfront Place is an historic coal shed built over a hundred years ago for Chelmsford Gas Works.


A modern extension was added thirty years ago to accommodate a popular restaurant. It has been vacant for the past ten years.

We have been granted planning permission to turn it into a church building with a hall for 230 people, a community space, kitchen, outdoor seating area, meeting rooms and offices.

Alongside the church will be a new coffee shop; the first community space in this growing new development.

Management

City Church Chelmsford is a part of the Danbury Mission Church Charitable Incorporated Organisation. The charity is led by a joint team of elders for Danbury Mission Church and City Church.

The elders at Danbury Mission
Church have led multiple building
projects; including the £3 million
redevelopment of their building ten
years ago including a commercial
quality coffee shop. The leadership
team has a proven track record of
planning and executing projects on
this scale and are financially stable
with 2022 general income of £703k,
expenditures of £672k and available
reserves of £232k.

The charity is governed by the Charities Commission in England and Wales, registration number 1179638. The constitution, charitable objectives, trustees and accounts are available on the Charity Commission website.

Mission Essex



Mission Essex is a collection of churches working to share the good news of Jesus with Essex.

Essex was once a major gospel centre for England that saw one of the country's first churches planted, raised leaders like Charles Spurgeon, and sent missionaries like John Eliot and Thomas Hooker.

Today 2 million people live in Essex and it's the fastest growing part of the country. But only 3% are connected to a church. (The national average is 5%, with 8% in London).

Most have never heard the gospel and Christians often travel outside their local community to get to a church.

To simply keep up with population growth and sustain 3% attendance, we'd need 30 more church plants over the next 10 years.

We support pastors relationally with weekly meet-ups. We also support churches practically with their regulations, safeguarding, premises, etc.

We share what we can with one another.
We host annual events for the whole network. We also host termly training nights on topics like youth work, home group, and worship music for our network.

We send people and resources to enable the planting of new churches and revitalisation of old churches across Essex.
